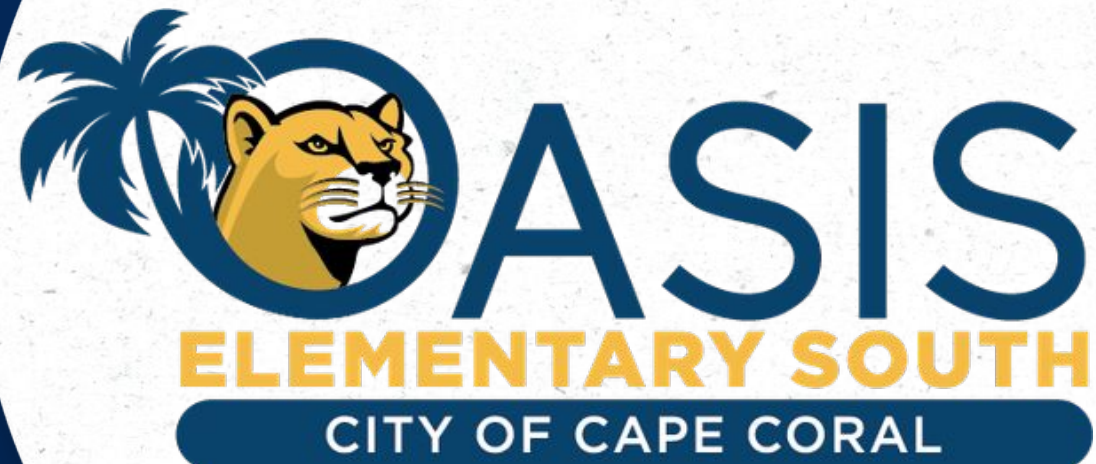

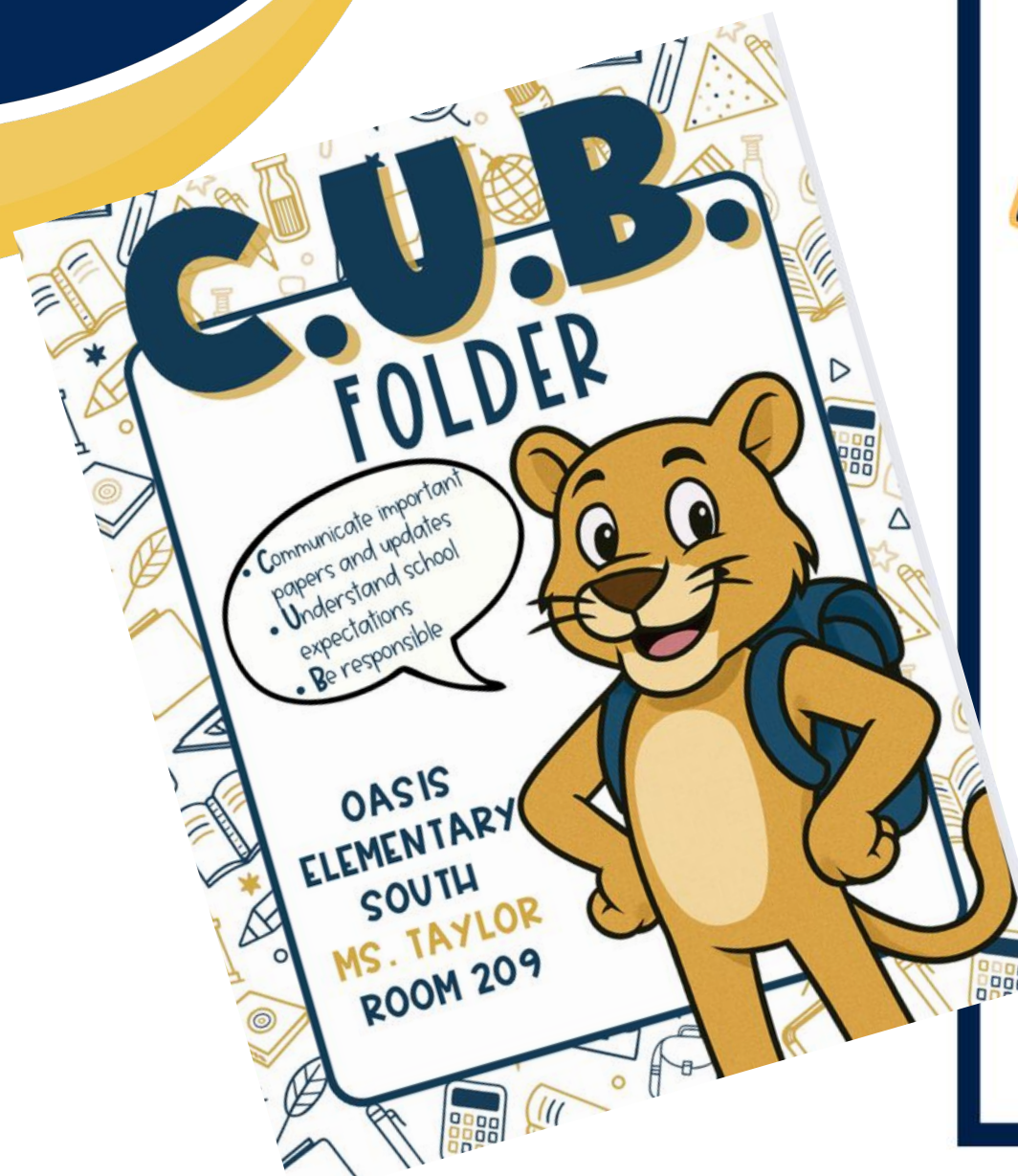

AM Car Line

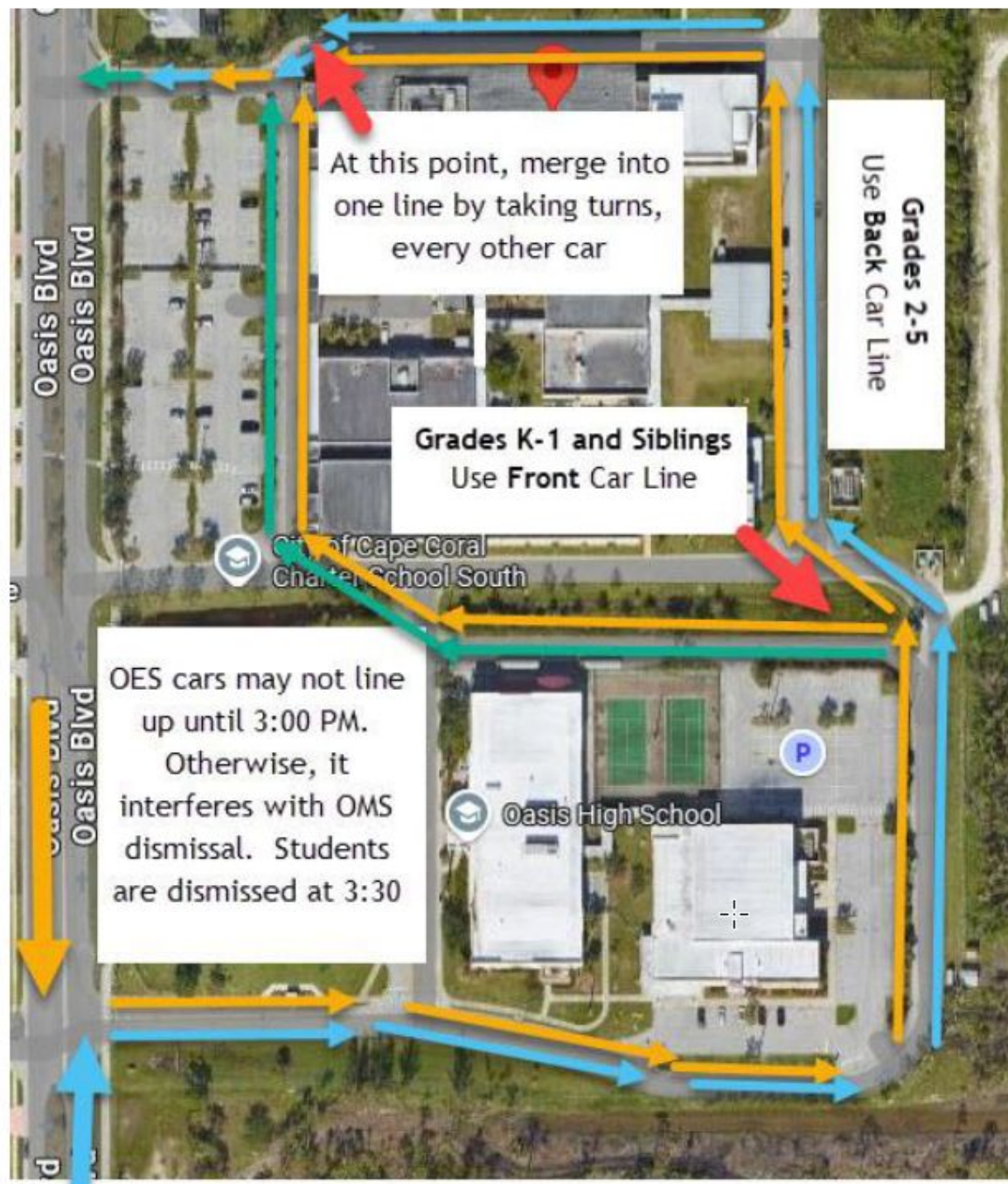

PM Car Line



- Please do not line up before 3:00 pm.
- Car line will start at 3:30 pm.
- All cars must remain in PARK, until they have been given the signal to proceed.
- If there is lightning within 10 miles of school, car lines will be stopped until the threat has cleared. In the event of a weather issue, a Parent Square message will be sent to notify you of the procedure to follow.
- Remain in your vehicle at all times.
- **THE CAR LINE WILL TAKE LONGER THE FIRST FEW WEEKS OF SCHOOL. PLEASE BE PATIENT AND PLAN ACCORDINGLY.**

Dismissal Procedures-Walkers

Even if your child is a walker, please keep your car tag accessible for pick up.

If you would like to request that your child be a walker, they must live within 1.5 miles of our school. The address listed in FOCUS will be used. Please complete the form to get approved. Your child will not be dismissed as a walker until the form is approved, yearly.

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Car Tags

Even if your child is not a car rider, please keep your car tag in your vehicle for unexpected times they will be a car rider.

- **If you need an additional car tag, please complete the form.**
- **Every vehicle coming through car line must have a current school year issued car tag.**
 - **Car tags should be easily visible from a distance.**
 - **Students will not be released to cars without car tags, no exceptions.**
 - **If you do not have your car tag, you must bring ID to the office.**

Remove car tag after your student enters your vehicle.

WICOR

Writing

Writing is:

- A tool for communication, reflection, and learning
- Inquiry
- Visible organization of thought
- Communication with authentic audiences

Inquiry

Inquiry is:

- Uncovering one's understanding
- Critical thinking and questioning
- Exploring a variety of ways to solve problems
- Engaging in thinking, learning, and discussion to inspire innovation

Collaboration

Collaboration is:

- Positive group interactions
- Teamwork with shared responsibility
- Sharing of ideas, information, and opinions

Organization

Organization is:

- Managing materials, time, and self
- Practicing methodical study habits
- Planning and prioritizing school, work, and social tasks

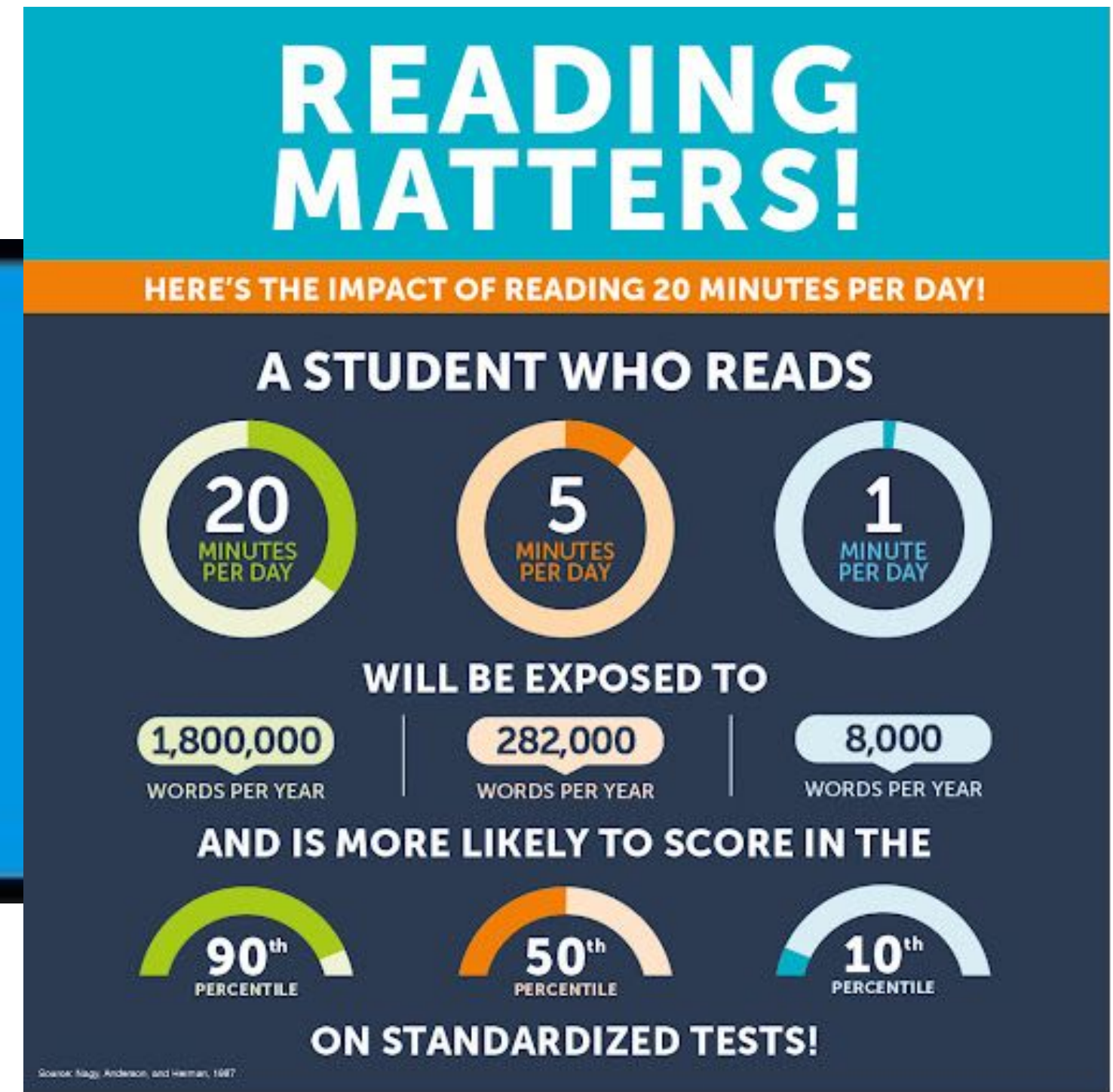

Volunteers

All Field Trip Chaperones are required to have LEVEL 2 Clearance.

The State of Florida Level 2 clearance for school volunteers requires fingerprint-based background screening, checking state and national criminal records, and searching sexual predator registries. It applies to unsupervised volunteers or field trip chaperones, costs around \$85, and stays valid for 5 years.
